We cordially invite you to attend the 2025 Maize Genetics Meeting at the Union Station, St. Louis, Missouri, USA, beginning with the evening meal on Thursday, March 6th, and continuing until noon on Sunday, March 9th, 2025. This year's meeting will feature four keynote speakers: Doreen Ware, USDA-ARS; Jonathan F. Wendel, Iowa State University; Ivan Baxter, Donald Danforth Plant Science Center; and Sióbhan Brady, HHMI and UC Davis. There will also be a keynote talk from the 2025 McClintock Prize awardee, Edward S. Buckler IV, USDA-ARS. In addition, Helen Anne Curry from Georgia Tech will give our Fostering Diversity in the Maize Research Community keynote. If you want to attend the optional activities, please plan your travel accordingly. Registration for the pre- and post-meeting activities will be announced separately.

TALKS, POSTERS, and ABSTRACTS deadlines are Wednesday, January 8, 2025.

In addition to the plenary, fostering diversity, and McClintock speakers, the program will include ~30 short talks (15 minutes each) selected from submitted abstracts, ~20 lightning talks (2 minutes each, 1 slide), and extended poster sessions. All abstracts must be submitted electronically by the January 8, 2025 deadline via the Abstract Form on the MGM website. Abstract submission is separate from the meeting registration and lodging reservation procedures.

In the abstract form you'll indicate whether you wish to present a poster or be considered for a short talk. Due to time constraints, some authors who request short talks will be asked to present their data in poster format instead. Those presenting a poster can opt-in to be considered for a lightning talk. Authors of short talk abstracts will be notified of format decisions via email by February 1st, 2025. Poster presenters will be notified by February 4th, 2025 if their abstract has been selected for a lightning talk. Consistent with past practice and the spirit of collegiality and inclusivity within the maize community, all poster abstracts by registered attendees will be accepted; you will NOT receive a separate confirmation that your poster abstract has been accepted. By submitting your abstract for short-talk consideration, you are consenting to your presentation being recorded and made available to in-person attendees and those who register for recording access. Recordings will be accessed through a password-protected site for six months after the meeting. Following these six months, you will have the option to not include your talk in the public archive that will be hosted on MaizeGDB.

Maximum poster dimensions are 114cm horizontal x 104cm vertical (45 inches horizontal x 40 inches vertical).

CONTEST TO DESIGN THE 2025 MEETING LOGO:

A logo for the cover of the abstract book and conference t-shirt will be selected from designs submitted by cooperators. Please submit original artwork via the <u>ABSTRACT</u> page on the MGM website, by January 8, 2025.

STUDENT FINANCIAL AID:

The steering committee is soliciting federal grants and industry donations to help defray meeting costs for graduate students and for those undergraduates who are the first and presenting author of a poster or talk. If the student is eligible for financial aid and fundraising efforts are as successful as in previous years, then the hotel room will be paid upon check out. This year, students from outside the United States are also encouraged to apply. To apply, a student must:

There are five additional awards intended to broaden meeting participation. **Most applications are due by December 2**;

see https://www.maizegdb.org/mgc/maizemeeting/2025/financialaid.php for details. 1) A limited number of MaGNET Awards are available to support travel costs for students and researchers from underrepresented groups (restricted to U.S. citizens and permanent residents). 2) The Expanding Institutional Access (EIA) Program seeks to recruit and retain scientists from diverse institutions including community colleges, primarily undergraduate and masters granting institutions (restricted to U.S. citizens and permanent residents). 3) The Disciplinary Breadth (DB) Award will provide support for researchers in plant-related disciplines (restricted to U.S. citizens and permanent residents). 4) The Roots & Shoots Travel Award will support a limited number of travel awards for student/mentor pairs affiliated with SACNAS or MANRRS. This travel award is open to international applicants, including non-US citizens and those affiliated with an institution outside of the United States. 5) The Broadening International Participation (BIP) Program seeks to promote international access to the recordings of all talks (short talks, invited speakers, etc.) made at the 2025 Maize Genetics Meeting meeting for researchers from countries that are historically under-represented at the Maize Meeting and/or who may face financial challenges in paying registration fees.
