

POSTER IMAGES

Poster files can be prepared as for an in-person conference.

Poster resolution should be at or near 2530 x 2249.

The aspect ratio of 45 inches horizontal x 40 inches vertical required for the in-person meeting can be used here.

Accepted file formats: .png, .pdf and .jpg

LIGHTNING VIDEOS

Each 5-minute video is a lightning talk, similar to what you might give, or have observed, at an in-person conference. For the 5-minute poster video recordings, we suggest that the introductory slide be a complete poster image. Two to three subsequent slides can be used to highlight individual figures, tables, key results and conclusions. This should be a “lightning” summary of the poster, including:

- broader significance
- hypothesis or research goal
- approach
- key results
- conclusions and next steps

The recording cannot exceed 5 minutes and must be less than 100 MB.

Recording in PowerPoint

Windows:

-In the Slide Show menu, Select “Record Slide Show”. In addition to recording your narration, a video of yourself can be embedded in the corner of the slide.

-Hit Record and begin the presentation.

-When finished recording, hit “Export” and select “Create a Video”. Be sure to export as a MPEG-4 (mp4) video.

-Open the video and trim any extraneous content at the beginning or end of the recording. Review recording before submitting.

Mac:

-In the Slide Show menu, Select “Record Slide Show” and begin narrating to your poster slides.

-When finished speaking, hit “End Show”.

-Select “Export” under the File menu, and select MP4 as the File Type.

-Open the video and trim any extraneous content at the beginning or end of the recording. Review recording before submitting.

Recording in QuickTime or another video recording application:

Alternatively, one can use a video recording application (e.g. QuickTime Player) or web-based platform to record the screen, on which your poster slides can be viewed. Save the file as an mp4.

HELPFUL TIPS FOR RECORDING

-If you choose to film yourself speaking, make sure to have good lighting that is facing rather than behind you. For example, record in front of a window instead of having a window in the background of the video.

-If recording via Zoom or any web-based platform, try to record on a wired internet connection instead of Wifi to avoid any video lag or audio cutting out.

-Disable all notifications on your computer and phone, both sound and visual.

-Be sure to review the recording from beginning to end prior to submitting.
